Parent Payments for 2026

Noble Park Primary School is looking forward to another great year of teaching and learning, and we would like to advise you of our school's voluntary financial contributions for 2026. Schools provide students with free instruction to fulfil the standard curriculum, and we want to assure you that all contributions are voluntary and that students of families who are unable to make a contribution are not disadvantaged in any way. However, ongoing financial support of our families helps our school to enhance the learning experience beyond the mandated curriculum, for example, through special curriculum experiences, additional resources for learning opportunities and enhanced digital learning opportunities. Online payments can be made via Direct Deposit, EFT or CASH at the school's office, or by Direct Deposit.

Compass

Compass is Noble Park Primary School's Management System where parents and carers can access information about their child, such as attendance, academic reports, and communication with teachers.

Key Features:

- **Parent-teacher communication:** Parents can communicate directly with teachers and manage contact details.
- **Attendance monitoring:** Parents can view attendance records and enter explanations for absences or lateness.
- **Academic information:** Access and download academic reports, and view details of upcoming tasks and assessments.
- **School events:** Find information about upcoming events, view the school calendar, and manage bookings for parent-teacher conferences.
- **Payments and consent:** Provide consent and payment for events and contribute to school fees.
- **School news:** Stay updated with the latest school news and announcements.

How to get started:

1. **Log in:** Use the unique username and password provided by the school to log in through a web browser or the Compass app. Did not receive your login? Please contact the school on 03 9546 8811 or email us at noble.park.ps@education.vic.gov.au and request a new login letter.
2. **Update details:** On your first login, you will likely be prompted to change your password and confirm your email address and mobile number.
3. **Explore:** Click on your child's name to go to their profile, where you can see a dashboard and navigate through tabs for more detailed information on attendance, reports, and more...

Accessibility:

You can **access Compass** through any modern web browser or by downloading the [Compass app](#) from the Apple or Google Play stores.

Before And After School Supervision

Student safety at Noble Park Primary School is our highest priority and the safe and appropriate supervision of students is an important element of our duty of care to students. Part of this duty is ensuring parents, carers and students are aware of our student supervision arrangements before and after school.

Before school

The school grounds are supervised between 8:30am - 9:00am. A teacher will be on yard duty at the front gate * Buckley Street between 8:30am - 9:00am. Students are required to be at the front of the school (netball court) between 8:30am – 8:45am. From 8:45am, a teacher will also be on yard duty at the back of the school (handball court and basketball court) *Leonard Avenue.

After school

The school grounds are supervised between 3:30pm - 3:45pm. A teacher will be allocated to yard duty at the front gate * Buckley Street and back gate *Leonard Avenue of the school between these times.

Please note: All other areas of the school are out of bounds between 8:45am – 9am.

DS Sports – Out of Hours School Care

DS Sports provides an engaging and interesting After School Program at Noble Park Primary School. All families are encouraged to register their child/ren for DS Sports as it is free to enrol and while you are under no obligation to use this service it does provide support for you in an emergency. Breakfast Club

Noble Park Primary School runs a breakfast club each morning from **8:30am to 8:50am**. Breakfast club is open to students and their families and there is no charge to attend. Funding from the government's breakfast club program and Food Bank is provided to the school and is used to support our students and their families. Education Support staff and teachers facilitate Breakfast Club each morning.

Bike and Scooter Safety



All bike and scooter riders are required to wear a bike helmet in Victoria. Approved helmets have the Australian Standards Mark TM (AS/NZS 2063) and will be marked suitable for cycling. Children under the age of 12 may ride on footpaths, as can a supervising adult. They are required to give way to pedestrians and to wheel their bicycles over pedestrians and children's crossings. Also, by law everyone must wear a seat belt when travelling in a car in Australia.
