#### Swimming Program 2025

Our swimming program starts next week. Please ensure that your child has bathers, a dry towel and a waterproof bag every morning. #### The Importance of Being at School Before 9am

#### Professional Development for Staff

At Noble Park Primary School, we are committed to strengthening the skills of our highly motivated teachers and education support staff to enhance explicit teaching for our students. Staff professional learning is continuous and develops the delivery of high-quality teaching and learning programs across the school. This week, teachers have learnt about an explicit teaching strategy called *Cold Calling*, which they are now applying in the classroom. The purpose of *Cold Calling* is to actively engage students in the thinking process.

### What to pack for swimming

Please come to school wearing your bathers underneath your school uniform and hair tied up. Wear socks and sneakers. Pack your underwear to put on after swimming.

### Supervision around water

All children require active supervision around water regardless of their swimming ability.

Beaches, pools, ponds, lakes, rivers and bathtubs all present a drowning risk. Twenty seconds is all it takes for a child to drown in as little as a few centimetres of water.

The best way to keep children safe is to keep under-fives within arm's reach, and under 10s within eyesight around water at all times. It's a good idea to make and stick to a supervision plan so there is always an adult actively supervising children around waterways during gatherings or parties, even during the winter months!

Supervise: Actively supervise children around water

Restrict: Restrict children's access to water

Teach: Teach children water safety skills

Respond: Learn how to respond in the

case of an emergency
