Today Noble Park Primary School conducted an Offsite Emergency Drill.

All staff, students and visitors evacuated to Copas Park located on Buckley Street. This was done in an efficient and safe manner which was fantastic to see! This process assists the school to effectively respond to emergencies and incidents should they arise. This Offsite Emergency Drill is aligned to Emergency and Critical Incident Management Planning as per the Department of Education.

Upcoming Respectful Relationships Learning in the Senior Learning House

In our upcoming Resilience, Rights and Respectful Relationships lessons, the Year 5 and 6 students will focus on Stress Management. They will learn to identify potential sources of stress at school, at home, and in the classroom. Students will then explore strategies they can use to reduce stress. To support this, they will take part in collaborative activities that use play to elevate their mood, along with self-calming practices such as guided meditation.

Last week, Senior Learning House students spent time with a buddy class in the Junior Learning House. They interviewed their younger buddies and chose a picture story to read together. It was a fantastic chance for our senior students to demonstrate kindness and practise their leadership skills while supporting the junior students. These sessions formed part of our ongoing values lessons focusing on 'Be Kind'.

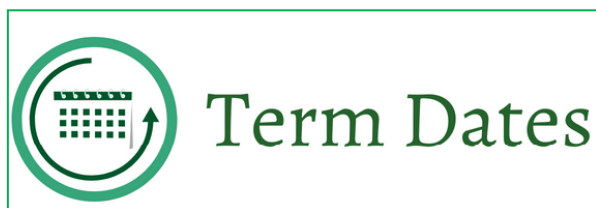
Parent Payments for 2026
